The Applied Law Level 3 BTEC is designed to appeal to learners who are interested in a career in law or who are planning to go to university and want to gain a good understanding of law. This course carries the same UCAS points as the A-level.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ A minimum of 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above (including English Language). Level 2 vocational qualifications (e.g. BTEC/OCR) must be a merit grade or above and only one will count as one GCSE equivalent.

METHODS OF ASSESSMENT



ASSESSMENT IS 50% COURSEWORK AND 50%
