Within the month of February our students took part in the following activities:

We kick started the month with **Welling's Got Talent**. It was a delight to see so many singers, dancers and musicians attend this sell out performance in early February. The atmosphere was electric, as students from all year groups took to the stage to wow a panel of very impressed judges. Following a positive start to the year, students have continued to engage with the Wise UP mentoring programme. A total of 30 students have signed up and attended group sessions and 10 new students signed up to take part in after school creative arts skills development skills workshops and are working towards developing original dance routines and producing songs. This month, 15 students participated in 'Inspire and enable' workshops delivered by Sharkira Lueshing, a previous contestant on the Voice UK and Radio presenter, who is now thriving in the creative industries and has recently partnered with PYE to work in schools supporting girls and young females. Shakira delivered a powerful talk to a group of year 8 – 11 girls which was well received and very engaging. She shared her own childhood difficulties, school experiences and offered tips and advice related to what it takes, and to make it in the industry. Many myths and stereotypes were challenged and students were provided with truthful insights in the interests of safeguarding against and raising awareness on sexual exploitation and staying safe She was able to reinforce positive messages around importance of working hard, time keeping and following instructions which registered with students. The students who participated report that they thoroughly enjoyed and found the session useful.



During the half term, year 13 students visited the ancient city of Naples and Sorrento. They explored the ruins of Pompeii, climbed to the top of Mount Vesuvius and navigated the deep underground tunnels of Naples. As well as all of the exploring, students embraced the culture and ate a lot of pizza, taking the opportunity to make their own in a pizza cooking class! A huge thank you to Mr Foster and Miss Vosper for coming with us. Italy we will be back!













Before half term, we invited some of our Year 11 applicants to come and experience some 6th Form lessons and meet some of the 6th Form students.

Students took part in A-Level activities in a range of different subjects including our new subject offer Graphics with Miss Moore.









In Maths 50 students in years 9 & 10 completed the United Kingdom Mathematics Trust (UKMT) Intermediate Challenge. 8 of our students gained National recognition with bronze, silver or gold certificates.

In Science year 9s have enjoyed investigating how pH can affect rate of enzyme catalysed reaction.

Students in the Science club used different separation techniques to see who can extract the most pure salt from a mixture of rock salt.

Some selected year 10s have started intervention sessions in Science to get a head start on scoring top scores for their GCSEs.

Many students have been attending Saturday intervention for targeted revision. Wednesday intervention's attendance has also been increasing in the build up to their final exam.





Record numbers arrived to take part in auditions for our Summer musical 'Grease'. Students learnt and performed choreography, script work and solo songs in order to gain a part in the show. They displayed talent, resilience, courage and kindness throughout and we can't wait to share the show with you in the Summer term.

This term we have launched our first ever gaming club. This is currently aimed at Y7 students with scope to grow to other years. We have also just purchased a shiny new Playstation 5 as part of this club.



Students at the Language Cafe have been working on their role play presentation of the Italian Cafe which will take place next term with the students role playing chefs, waiters cashiers and customers in an Italian pizzeria. Guests including Mr Griffen, Ms Gooch and Ms Reid will be invited along to participate in the role play as guests in the Italian Cafe. 25 GCSE and A Level Spanish students participated on a school trip to Seville Spain. This gave the students the opportunity to practise their spoken Spanish and to experience Spanish culture first hand. We visited the Giralda tower, the Real Alcazar and the Maestranza bullring. An adventure quest enabled students to work in teams to find answers to questions on Spanish culture and Seville. Churros, tortilla and croquetas were all tried, and the highlight was a meal and Flamenco show. The students had a great time and arrived home cansado pero feliz! Following on from the successful Jack Petchey Speak Out workshop that was undertaken by a group of year 10 students, 4 students were selected to present their speeches in Year 7 assembly. All 4 of our student speakers were fantastic, but the overall winner was the fabulous Esther Odejimi!



Netball: Welling School vs Blackfen


Girls from Y7 and Y8 did a fantastic job and put a lot effort into the game which they unfortunately lost but we are still very much looking forward to future matches.
