Welling School Sixth Form Results 2023

We are delighted to be able to share our students' achievements after receiving the first set of results for this year's examination series.

The Sixth Form curriculum at Welling School offers a number of pathways beyond the traditional route meaning our students have a truly bespoke curriculum to maximise their achievement. We are extremely proud of an overall pass rate of 95% pass rate in Academic A-Level qualifications. This figure marks a significant increase in attainment.

Initial figures also indicate excellent achievements across all courses with 100% pass rates in Biology, Chemistry, English Language, English Literature, Fine Art, History, Geography, Mathematics, Photography and Sociology. In the applied vocational and Technical courses students achieved 100% pass rates in 11 of the 13 courses offered.

In all curriculum routes there is a pleasing increase in the number of students achieving more of the highest A and A* grades with Technical courses seeing an impressive 5% increase in this measure from 2022.

Welling School is driven to ensure that all students go on to the university or career of their choice and at the time of going to press all students, completing their Sixth Form studies with us, this summer, have achieved the grades they need to take up their university, apprenticeship or job offers. Some of the destinations students are moving onto include University in Greenwich, Kent, Birmingham, Brighton and Medway School of Pharmacy. There are also Russell Group places at King's College London, Cardiff and Queen Mary's. Students are also moving on to start careers and apprenticeships in nurseries, the metropolitan police, physiotherapy for the Freddie Farmer Foundation and Accounting and Finance.

Like last year, the disruption caused by the pandemic makes this year's results even more impressive. Not only because students have had to work hard in very difficult circumstances but also because they went into the exam season with absolutely no prior experience of formal examinations as they never had to sit GCSE papers. Assessment and testing mechanisms have now largely returned to pre-pandemic models

and so these achievements have been made without the same level of dispensation we have seen in the past 2 years.

As well as key individual successes the overall grades indicate that 41% are A*, A, B and C grades. This includes an overall pass rate of 94%. Students performed strongly in Sociology with 44% of grades A-B and 28% of Business Studies grades were awarded a Distinction*. This is a highly commendable achievement.
